FOURTH EASTER SUNDAY -A

Strike the shepherd and the sheep will scatter runs an ancient proverb. In order, however, to understand all the nuances of this familiar parable “of the Good Shepherd” we should know something of the pastoral milieu within which Jesus spoke. The first point is obvious: *security of the flock is paramount.* To protect their animals shepherds devised a number of strategies. The more common was that of *corralling* them into a primitive enclosure or stone, briars or rubble (about two feet high) with only one opening across which the vigilant shepherd would restively lie. The sheep or goats thus were safely guarded under the watchful eye of the herdsman ever aware of such dangerous nocturnal predators as lions, bears, wolves and jackals that then ranged in ancient Palestine. At dawn after a suspenseful night, the shepherd would enter the enclosure, whistle or call for his sheep, count heads and set out for pasturage and water. Today specially trained dogs and horses drive the sheep *before* them; ancient shepherds *led* the flock out in search of sustenance. It is precisely this image of the shepherd *leading his flock* that so delighted Jesus and his hearers.

Both the religious leaders of the past and present can take this parable to heart. Excelling in the Law and observances hedged in stringent commands must give way to a ministry of teaching patiently and lovingly healing in the example of the Good Shepherd. The parable tells us that we are to be ready to give our lives for others by vigilance. As we imitate the Good Shepherd those fears and needless anxieties soon fade as we hear his voice above the din of pressures and discordant voices. If we would only allow ourselves to listen!
